
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MESSAGE

FOREWORD

Shelter is one of the basic requirements for human survival. The possession of a house brings in a profound social change in one's existence; owning a home is one of the top priorities for most people in India, regardless of their income levels. Affordable housing to all, especially the poor, is a key national goal. Thus, a regular flow of reliable data on housing conditions of the people has assumed critical significance for the Government of India, State Governments and planning and implementing agencies for housing programmes such as Development Authorities, Housing Boards, Housing Corporations and Urban Local Bodies. Data on housing, basic services and building construction activities are necessary for the formulation, execution, monitoring and evaluation of housing policies and programmes which represent an integral part of the overall social and economic development agenda of the country in the framework of inclusive growth. A good database on 'Housing' and 'Housing Amenities' is a key requirement for planning and judicious use of plan resources to meet the shelter needs of the people across States/Union Territories (Uts).

Considering the need for authentic and reliable data for designing of policies and programmes for affordable housing, the National Buildings Organisation (NBO) has launched a massive effort to build databases covering the areas of urban poverty, slums, housing and urbanization-related indicators. The Ministry of Housing & Urban Poverty Alleviation has designated NBO as the nodal statistical agency in this regard. A new scheme of "Urban Statistics for HR & Assessments (USHA)" has also been launched by the Ministry of Housing & Urban Poverty Alleviation, with NBO as the national nodal agency. USHA aims at the development and maintenance of a national database, MIS and national knowledge repository covering housing, construction, urban poverty, slums, and other urbanization-related statistics. It also provides support for action research

and capacity building activities in the relevant fields. A key objective of USHA is to support the Ministry of Housing & Urban Poverty Alleviation, other Ministries and State Governments with information base and necessary knowledge inputs for the purposes of planning, policy-making, project designing, formulation, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of programmes, especially those relating to urban poverty alleviation, slum development and affordable housing.

The present document, "Compendium on State of Housing in India-2013" is an effort by NBO under the scheme of USHA. I am thankful to Dr. P.K. Mohanty, the then Additional Secretary & Mission Director (JNNURM) and Shri Sanjeev Kumar, Joint Secretary & Mission Director (JNNURM & RAY) for his constant guidance and support. I whole-heartedly appreciate the hard work put in by the dedicated NBO team of officers who made this Compendium possible comprising Shri Umraw Singh, Joint Director (JRPC), Shri Praveen Kumar, Deputy Director (NRC), Shri B.U. Meshram, Statistical Officer etc.

I would welcome suggestions for improving this document as a statistical guide on the trends, patterns and issues of housing and housing amenities in India, containing useful tables, data and statistical analysis. We intend to update this document at regular intervals. I hope this publication would be of value to those interested in the issues relating to housing sector and housing policy in India.

1 **Housing in India: Introduction and Approach**

1. Introduction

1.1 The 2011 Census of India reveals that the urban population of the country stood at 377 million or 31.16 percent of the total population. This is estimated to have increased to 437 million by 2021, which is about 36 percent of the total population. It is projected that the urban population would grow to about 553 million in 2026. The level of urbanization is expected to reach 50 percent mark in the next 3-4 decades. Urbanisation and economic growth are closely interlinked, as more than 60 percent of Gross Domestic Product of the country is contributed by Urban India. As India moves ahead to a double-digit growth, obviously a key policy issue has emerged as to how to rejuvenate and strengthen the Urban India, which will significantly contribute and sustain the growth momentum.

1.2 Housing is regarded as an ‘engine of economic growth’ and can give a big push to the economy through its strong ‘backward’ and ‘forward’ linkages with about 250 ancillary industries. As per an IIM Ahmedabad Study (July 2000), housing investment has inter-industry linkages and investment in housing/construction sector has strong multiplier effects on generation of income and employment in the economy. A unit increase in the final expenditure on the construction sector would generate additional income in the economy as a whole, which would be almost 5 times as high as the direct income generated within the construction sector itself. Further, investment in housing has an employment multiplier effect of almost 8. This indicates that an additional unit of final expenditure in construction sector induces an overall employment generation in the economy by an extent that is eight times the direct employment generated in the construction sector itself.

2. Approach to Housing & Initiatives

2.1 Recognising the importance of housing in the country as a basic human need, it has been one of the priorities of the Government of India right from the First Five Year Plan till date. Government has provided various fiscal incentives to promote housing on both, the demand and supply sides. Since independence, a large number of schemes have been launched under different names, but the focus continues to be on housing for the poor. The core of all the housing initiatives is to concentrate efforts on improvement of the housing conditions of industrial workers/ economically weaker sections and of low-income groups, through housing schemes, involving an element of subsidy ranging between 20 percent to 50 percent. All the housing programmes have resulted in the positive growth in the total housing stock, which has increased from 13.30 million units in 1961 to 78.48 million units in 2011.

2.2 According to the Report of the Technical Group (TG-12) on Estimation of Urban Housing Shortage, the total urban housing shortage in the country in 2012 recorded a decline from (24.71) Million at the beginning of 11th five year Plan as estimated by 11th Plan Technical Group to 18.78 million in the beginning of the 12th Plan as estimated by TG-12.

It is worth noting that 96 per cent of this shortage pertains to the economically weaker sections and the lower income groups of the society. The urban housing shortage during the 12th Five Plan period (2012-2017) may even come lower if the rate of growth in housing stock continues to be higher than the growth in number of Households in the 12th Five Year Plan, as observed in the last decade. Assuming the business as usual scenario and also continuation of the strategic intervention both at State & Central level, housing shortage may actually go down.

2.3 Government has always been sensitive to the needs of the urban poor and it has addressed the magnitude of housing shortages by launching several programmes, mainly aimed at catering to the needs of poorer segments of the society. Some of the recent programmes for housing the poor include: Two Million Housing Programme, Valmiki Amedkar Awas Yojana (VAMBAY), Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM), Interest Subsidy for Housing the Urban Poor (ISHUP), Affordable Housing in Partnership (AHIP) Scheme, and interest subvention scheme. Also as a broad policy initiative, the Government of India announced its first ever ‘National Urban Housing and Habitat Policy (NUHHP)’ in 2007 with the challenging goal of ‘Affordable Housing for All’ and to advocate the aims and areas of action with which to progress towards it. Innovative approaches advocated by the NUHHP-2007 include the reservation of 10-15 percent of land or 20-25 percent Floor Space Index (FSI)/Floor Area Ratio (FAR) under private sector development for EWS and LIG housing, either by regulation in new developments in expansion areas of existing towns and greenfield townships, or by the grant of higher FSI in already built up areas together with Transferable Development Rights (TDRs) to accelerate private investment in the provision of houses for the poor. The initiatives under active consideration of the Ministry of Housing & Urban Poverty Alleviation (MoHUPA) in Government of India include Review of National Urban Land Policy, Model Real Estate Regulation Act, Model Legal Framework for assigning Property Rights to Slum Dwellers, and Housing Start-Up Index (HSUI).

2.4 The other efforts taken by the Govt. of India towards affordable housing include setting up a Committee to establish Housing Micro-Finance Institution for the housing needs of poor in the informal sector, the report of which has already been received by the MoHUPA. Some states like Punjab, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Karnataka and Madhya Pradesh have already developed State Housing and Habitat Policy, while many other states/UTs are in the process of developing it. Moreover, several states have started programmes within the state sector for social housing, some of which are as ambitious as the JNNURM. Andhra Pradesh, for example, has adopted a policy of meeting housing needs of the poor by a saturation approach; Uttar Pradesh has a large programme for urban housing; and Maharashtra has set itself a target of 20 lakh houses within this plan period 2012-17.

2.5 One of the important developments in the urban housing sector is the launching of the Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM) – with components of Basic Services to the Urban Poor (BSUP) and Integrated Housing & Slum Development Programme (IHSDP) - in 2005. Besides JNNURM, two other housing programmes that have been launched by the Government of India are Interest Subsidy Scheme for Housing the Urban Poor (ISHUP) and Affordable Housing in Partnership - launched in February 2009. Together, they address the “supply side” issues of affordable housing and aim to enable the construction of about 25 lakh houses with basic amenities for the Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) and Low Income Groups (LIG) by the end of 12th Five Year Plan. About 15.7 lakh houses have so far been sanctioned for execution, all under the flagship programme of JNNURM.

2.6 As components of JNNURM, the BSUP and IHSDP have achieved a fair amount of success with the overarching aims of focusing State attention on the problems of inequity in urban areas, and drawing budgetary resources to the welfare of the urban poor. Cities have begun earmarking funds within their budgets for the urban poor and an increasing number of State Governments have notified regulations for reservation of land for EWS/LIG sections housing in all new developments. About 2/3rd of the JNNURM housing is being provided by conferring entitlements in-situ including provision for upgradation of infrastructure of existing slums. Simultaneously, there is an acceptance at policy level, both in the State and Municipality, that the emergence of new slums can be prevented only by increasing the availability of land and affordable housing for the urban poor, which in turn requires that the market-distorting shortages of land and housing be corrected.

2.7 Considering the need to intensify efforts and accord a new deal to slum-dwellers, the President of India, in her address to both the Houses of Parliament on 4th June 2009 declared the resolve of the Government to usher in a Slum-free Urban India through the launching of Rajiv Awas Yojana (RAY). In pursuance of the Government's vision of creating a Slum-free India, RAY has been launched on 02.06.2011. The Phase I of Rajiv Awas Yojana which is for a period of two years from the date of approval of the scheme is the preparatory phase and is currently under implementation. The Phase II of RAY shall be there for the remaining period of the 12th Five Year Plan. Under the Scheme, Central Assistance will be extended to States that are willing to assign property rights to slum dwellers and undertake reservation of land/Floor Area Ratio (FAR)/dwelling units for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS)/Low Income Groups (LIG), earmark 25 per cent of municipal budget for basic services to the urban poor/slum-dwellers and bring in legislative amendments and policy changes to redress land and affordable housing shortages for the urban poor.

The most critical constraint to affordable housing and dignified living with access to basic services for the poor in cities is the lack of availability of land at affordable prices. This is explained in terms of lack of 'legal' space or tenure security in the existing slums; absence of implementation of reservation of land for EWS/LIG housing and informal sector activities in Master Plans for cities, spiraling urban land prices that have soared on the adoption of land as a resource raising policy by states and municipalities. Another key constraint to affordable housing to the urban poor is the lack of adequate credit flow to the segment at affordable interest rates for the construction of low-income houses which is critically important for the poor if they are not to be squeezed out of the formal housing market. Another constraint is the availability of rental housing for new migrants from rural areas and small towns seeking jobs in cities. Rajiv Awas Yojana is expected to adopt a holistic approach with a package of measures to address the issues of land for housing and facilitate the construction of affordable houses for the urban poor. This scheme proposes to guarantee the lending agencies for loans given to EWS/LIG persons upto Rs. 5 Lakh without any third party guarantee or collateral security. National Housing Bank is the identified agency for operationalising CRGF. The CRGF Scheme has been launched on 31st October, 2012.

2.8 Housing and housing amenities are major indicators to gauge human well-being of a country. Any statistics on the living conditions, as exemplified by the type of housing available, average space available to each person in the house, the basic civic amenities available to the household etc. will depict the overall socio-economic progress of the society. Statistical information relating to housing condition in quantitative terms is essential for an

assessment of the overall housing needs and also for the formulation of housing policies and programmes. Thus, a regular flow of reliable data on housing has assumed considerable importance for the Government and planning bodies to enable them to give proper attention to the formulation, execution and evaluation of housing policies and programmes which constitute an integral part of the overall social and economic plans of the country. Adequate database on 'Housing' and 'Housing Amenities' is a mainstay for methodical planning and judicious use of plan resources equitably reaching the needy across the States/Union Territories (UTs). To have a good understanding of housing and housing amenities and to be able to understand the housing problem in its entirety and launch appropriate, timely and corrective steps to mitigate hardships of the houseless and poor, it is imperative to build up comprehensive database on various aspects of housing in the country which is essential for the formulation of an effective and coordinated policy. National Buildings Organisation (NBO), an attached office under the Ministry of Housing and Urban Poverty Alleviation, is the nodal agency for collecting, maintaining and disseminating authentic information on buildings statistics and housing in India. As part of its activities, NBO is bringing out the 'Housing in India – A Statistical Compendium'. This compendium contains state-wise rural-urban disaggregated data on housing, households and household amenities.

2.9 The statistical inputs have been taken from the Census of India-2011 and the following reports of the National Sample Survey Organization (NSSO):

- Housing Condition in India 49th Round (*Jan.1993-June.1993*)
- Housing Condition in India 58th Round (*July to December 2002*)
- Housing Condition and Amenities in India, 2008-09 65th Round (*July 2008-June 2009*)

2**Houses & Housing Condition in India-Census 2011****1. Number of Houses and Households**

1.1 Census of India in its decadal Census operation collects valuable information on number of houses and households, quality of houses in terms of good, livable and dilapidated in the country along with some of the important information on availability of basic amenities like safe drinking water, electricity and toilet facilities etc.


Total Houses (Table-1, Figure-1)

1.2 As per the 2011 Census, the total number of houses in India was 330.84 million. This includes 306.16 million occupied and 24.67 million vacant houses. The number of houses in rural area was 220.70 million with 207.12 million occupied houses and 13.58 million vacant houses; in urban areas the number was 110.14 million total houses, which includes 99.05 million occupied and 11.09 million vacant houses.


Total Households (Table-2, Figure-2):

1.3 The total number of households was 246.69 million in India as per 2011 Census and the All-India average household size was 4.9 persons. The number of rural households was 167.83 million (68 per cent), while the urban households were 78.86 million (32 per cent). The average household size was 4.9 and 4.8 persons respectively for rural and urban areas. Figure-2 shows the number of households in rural and urban areas in 2011.


Total Occupied Houses by Type of Use (Table-3, Figure-3):

1.4 There were 306.16 million occupied census houses in India as per 2011 Census. Of the occupied houses, houses used for both residential and residence-cum-other purposes were 244.64 million. Houses used for non-residential uses like shops, offices, schools, colleges, hotel, lodge, guest house, hospital, dispensary, place of worship, factories, etc. were numbered at 61.52 million. Among the 207.12 million total occupied houses in rural areas, those used for both residential and residence-cum-other purposes were 166.16 million and houses used for all other non-residential uses were 40.96 million. Out of the 99.05 million occupied houses in urban areas, the number of houses used for both residential and residence-cum-other purposes was 78.48 million while those used for all other non-residential uses were 20.56 million.

2. Houses by Construction Material Used in India


Houses by Material of Roof (Table-4, Figure-4):

2.1 Census 2011 has classified houses according to the construction material used for the roof, wall and floor of the structure. Accordingly, the number of houses with grass, thatch, bamboo, wood, mud, plastic and polythene as roof material was 49.06 million (16 percent), which include 44.19 million rural houses (i.e. 21 percent of total rural houses) and 4.87 million urban houses (5 percent of total urban houses). Houses with roof made of handmade tiles, machine made tiles, slate, GI metal, asbestos sheets etc. were 117.04 million (i.e. 38 per cent of total houses), which included 89.29 million rural houses (43 percent of total rural houses) and 27.73 million urban houses (28 percent of total urban houses). Houses with roof made of brick, stone, slate and concrete were 137.47 (45 percent of total houses), of which 72.22 million were rural houses (35 percent of total rural houses) and 65.25 million, urban houses (66 percent of total urban houses).

Houses by Materials of Wall (Table-5, Figure-5):

2.2 Houses with walls made of G.I. Metal, Asbestos Sheets, Brunt brick, Concrete materials were 159.86 million (52 percent); houses with walls made of Grass, Thatch, Bamboo, Plastic / Polythene, Mud, Un-burnt bricks & Wood were 99.28 million (33 percent); houses with walls made of Stone not packed with Mortar were 10.44 million (3 per cent) ; 33.04 million (11 percent) of houses were with walls made of Stone packed with Mortar and rest 2.26 million (0.7%) were with walls made of other categories materials. Among the total Rural Census houses, around 88.59 million (43 per cent) houses had walls made of G.I. Metal, Asbestos Sheets, Brunt brick, Concrete ; 87.64 million (42 per cent) houses with walls made of Grass, Thatch, Bamboo, Plastic / Polythene, Mud, Un-burnt bricks & Wood; 7.75 million (4 per cent) houses with walls made of Stone not packed with Mortar; 20.93 million (10 percent) houses were with walls made of Stone packed with Mortar and 1.65 million (0.6%) rest were with walls made of other categories of materials. Among the Urban houses, 71.27 million (72 percent) houses had walls made of G.I. Metal, Asbestos Sheets, Brunt brick, Concrete; houses with walls made of Grass, Thatch, Bamboo, Plastic / Polythene, Mud, Un-burnt bricks & Wood were 11.64 million (12 percent); houses with walls of materials Stone not packed with Mortar were 2.69 million (3 percent); houses with walls made of Stone packed with Mortar were 12.11 million (12 percent) and rest 0.61 million


(0.6%) were with walls made of other categories of materials.


Houses by Material of Flooring (Table-6, Figure-6):

2.3 Out of the total 304.88 million census houses in 2011 Census, the flooring of 141.26 million (46 percent) houses were made of mud, wood and bamboo; for 129.89 million (43 percent) houses floor was made of cement, burnt bricks and stones; for 2.27 million houses (11 percent) floor was made of mosaic and floor tiles; and the rest of 1.46 million (0.50 percent) houses floor was made of any other materials. Among the total 206.56 million Rural Census houses, floor was made of mud, wood and bamboo for 129.52 million (63 percent) houses; 69.07 million (33 percent) houses floor was made of cement, burnt bricks and stone; 7.43 million (4 percent) houses floor was made of mosaic, floor tiles; and the rest of 0.54 million (0.35 percent) houses had flooring made of other materials. Out of 98.32 million total Urban census houses, 11.74 million (12 percent) houses had flooring made of mud, wood and bamboo; about 60.82 million (62 percent) houses had flooring made of cement, burnt bricks and stone; 24.84 million (25 percent) houses had floor made of mosaic and floor tiles; and the remaining 0.92 million houses (1 percent) had flooring made of other materials.


3. Habitable Conditions of Census Houses (Table-7, Figure-7)

3.1 Out of the 244.64 million houses occupied for residence and residence-cum-other uses in India, 130.12 million (53 percent) were classified as ‘good habitable condition’ houses, followed by 101.44 million (41 percent) as ‘livable habitable condition’ houses and ‘dilapidated’ habitable condition houses were 13.05 million (5 percent). Among the 166.16 million Rural Census houses occupied for residence and residence-cum-other use as ‘good habitable condition’ houses were 76.36 million (46 percent); ‘livable habitable condition’ were 78.97 million (48 percent); while the houses in ‘dilapidated condition’ were 10.82 million (6 percent). Among the 78.48 million Urban census houses occupied for residential and residence-cum-other use, ‘good habitable condition’ houses were 53.76 million (68 percent); ‘livable habitable conditions’ were 22.47 million (29 per cent); while the houses in ‘dilapidated condition’ were 2.26 million (3 percent).


Households by Predominant Material of Roof (Table-8, Figure-8):

3.2 In the 2011 Census, out of the total 246.69 million households, 38.68 million (16 percent) households occupied houses with grass, thatch, bamboo, wood, mud, plastic and polythene, etc, as predominant material of roof. 58.65 million (24 percent) households occupied houses with roof made of Hand made Tiles & Machine made Tiles ; 37.51 million (15 percent) households occupied houses with roof made of Burnt brick, stone/slate; 110.93 million (45 percent) households occupied houses with Roof made of G.I. Metal, Asbestos sheets, Concrete and 0.92 million (0.38 percent) households occupied houses with Roof made of any other materials. Among the 167.83 million total Rural households, 34.54 million (21 percent) households occupied houses with roof made of grass, thatch, bamboo, wood, mud, plastic and polythene, etc ; 48.22 million (29 percent) households occupied houses with roof made of Hand made Tiles & Machine made Tiles; 26.97 million (16 per cent) households occupied houses with roof made of Burnt brick, stone/slate; 57.48 million (34 percent) households occupied houses with Roof made of G.I. Metal, Asbestos sheets, Concrete and 0.61 million (0.37 percent) households occupied houses with Roof made of any other materials. Among the 78.86 million Urban households, 4.14 million (5 per cent) households occupied houses with roof made of grass, thatch, bamboo, wood, mud, plastic and polythene, etc; 10.42 million (13 percent) households occupied houses with roof made of Hand made Tiles & Machine made Tiles; 10.54 million (13 percent) households occupied houses with roof made of Burnt brick, stone/slate; 53.45 million (68 percent) households occupied houses with Roof made of G.I. Metal, Asbestos sheets, Concrete and 0.31 million (0.40 percent) households occupied houses with Roof made of any other materials.

3.3 As per 2011 Census, out of 246.69 million total households, 83.04 million (34 percent) households occupied houses with walls made of grass, thatch, bamboo, plastic/polythene, mud, unburnt brick & wood etc; 8.27 million (3 percent) households occupied houses with walls made Stone not packed with Mortar; 26.54 million (11 percent) households occupied houses with wall made of Stone packed with Mortar; 127.52 million (52 percent) households occupied houses with Walls made of G.I./Metal/Asbestos Sheets, Burnt Brick, Concrete and 1.51 million (0.6 percent) households occupied houses with made of any other materials. In Rural areas, 72.91 million (43 percent) households occupied houses with walls made of grass, thatch, bamboo, plastic/polythene, mud, unburnt brick & wood etc; 6.11 million (4 percent) households occupied houses with wall made of Stone not packed with Mortar; 16.86 million (10 per cent) households occupied houses with wall made of Stone packed with Mortar; 70.87 million (42 percent) households occupied houses with Walls made of G.I./Metal/Asbestos Sheets, Burnt Brick, Concrete and 1.07 million (0.6 percent) households occupied houses with Walls made of any other materials. In Urban areas, 10.13 million (13 percent) households occupied houses with walls made of grass, thatch, bamboo, plastic/polythene, mud, unburnt brick & wood etc.; 2.16 million (3 percent) households occupied houses with wall made of Stone not packed with Mortar; 9.68 million (12 percent) households occupied houses with walls made of Stone packed with Mortar; 56.45 million (72




Households by Predominant Material of Floor (Table-10, Figure-10):

3.4 As per 2011 Census, out of 246.69 million total households, 116.30 million (47 percent) households occupied houses with Floor made of Mud, Wood Bamboo; 25.67 million (10 percent) households occupied houses with Floor made of Unburnt Brick, Stone; 103.55 million (42 percent) households occupied houses with Floor made of Cement, Mosaic Tiles and 1.17 million (0.48 percent) households occupied houses with Floor made of any other materials. In Rural areas, 106.38 million (63 percent) households occupied houses with Floor made of Mud, Wood Bamboo; 14.10 million (8 percent) households occupied houses with Floor made Unburnt Brick, Stone; 46.94 million (28 percent) households occupied houses with Floor made of Cement, Mosaic Tiles and 0.41 million (0.24 percent) households occupied houses with Floor made of any other materials. In Urban areas, among 78.86 million households, 9.93 million (12 percent) households occupied houses with Floor made of Mud, Wood Bamboo; 11.57 million (15 percent) households occupied houses with Floor made of Unburnt Brick, Stone; 56.61 million (72 percent) households occupied houses with Floor made of Cement, Mosaic Tiles and 0.76 million (1 percent) households occupied houses with Floor made of any other materials.


4. Households and Their Housing Conditions

Households by Their Habitable Condition of Census Houses Occupied (Table-11, Figure-11)

4.1 Households were further distributed by the Census-2011 of India in terms of the habitable conditions of houses into ‘good condition’, ‘livable condition’ and ‘dilapidated condition’. Among the 246.69 million total households living in residential and residence-cum-other use occupied census houses, 131.02 (53 percent) million households were living in ‘good condition’ houses, 102.47 million (42 percent) were living in ‘livable condition’ houses while households living in ‘dilapidated’ houses were 13.20 million (5 percent). Among 167.83 million rural households in residential and residence-cum-other use census houses, 77.04million (46 percent) households were living in ‘good condition’ houses, followed by 79.85 million (48 percent) households in ‘livable condition’ houses. Rural households in ‘dilapidated’ houses numbered 10.93 million (6 percent). Among 78.86 million urban households in residential and residence-cum-other use census houses, households living in ‘good condition’ houses were 53.98 million (68 percent); households living in houses of ‘livable conditions’ were 22.61 million (29 percent), while households in ‘dilapidated’ houses were 2.27 million (3 percent).


Households and Number of Dwelling Rooms (Table-12, Figure-12)

4.2 As per Census 2011, among total 246.69 million households, the number of households having one dwelling room and two dwelling rooms were 91.49 million (37 percent) and 78.12 million (32 percent) respectively. Households having three dwelling rooms were 35.80 million (14 percent) and households having four and more dwelling rooms numbered at 31.63 million (13 percent). Households having no exclusive dwelling room were 9.64 million (4 percent). Out of the 167.83 million total Rural households, 66.15 million (39 percent) households were living in one dwelling room, households in two dwelling rooms were 53.99 million (32 percent), households in three dwelling rooms were 21.31 million (13 percent) and households in four and more number of dwelling rooms were 19.16 million (11 percent). Households having no exclusive room were 7.21 million (4 percent). Out of the 78.86 million total urban households, households living in one dwelling room and two dwelling rooms were 25.34 million (32 percent) and 24.14 million (30 percent) respectively. Households living in three dwelling rooms were 14.49 million (18 percent) and households living in four and more number of rooms were 12.47 million (16 percent) and Households having no exclusive room were 2.43 million (3 percent).

Figure-12**Households Having Number of Dwelling Rooms -2011**



Households and Their Tenure Status (Table-13, Figure-13)

4.3 As per 2011 Census, out of total 246.69 million households in the country, households having own dwelling units were 213.53 million (87 percent) while households living in rented accommodation numbered 27.37 million (11 percent) and households in any other accommodation were 5.80 million (2 percent). Data on tenure status of dwelling units reveal that most of rural households were living in own dwellings i.e. 158.98 million (95 percent), while only 5.64 million (3 percent) Rural households had rented accommodation. Households in any other Rural accommodation numbered 3.20 million (2 percent). Among the Urban households, households living in own dwelling units were 54.54 million (69 percent), households in rented dwellings were 21.72 million (28 percent) and households in any other accommodation numbered 2.60 million (3 percent).


Households and Number of Married Couples (Table-14, Figure-14)

4.4 As per the Census 2011, out of 246.69 million households in the country, the number of households having one married couple were 172.96 million (70 percent), households having two married couples were 34.88 million (14 percent), households having three married couples were 7.91 million (3 percent) and households having four married couples at 1.73 million (1 percent). Around 28.64 million households (12 percent) had no married couples. Among 167.83 million Rural households, households having one married couple were 116.85 million (70 percent), households having two married couples were 24.94 million (15 percent), households having three married couples were 5.67 million (3 per cent) and households having four married couples were 1.28 million (1 percent). Rural households having no married couple were 18.63 million (11 percent). Among the 78.86 million urban households, households having one married couple were 56.11 million (71 percent); households having two married couples were 9.94 million (12 percent), households having three married couples were 2.25 million (3 percent) and households having four married couples were 1.28 million (1 percent). Urban households having no married couple were 10.01 million (13 percent).

5. Household Access to Basic Amenities & Services


Households and Availability of Drinking Water (Table-15, Figure-15):

5.1 According to 2011 Census, taps, hand-pumps and tubewells together constituted the major sources of drinking water in India. At the national level, 107.41 million households (43 percent) accessed taps as the source of drinking water, 103.52 million households (42 percent) had both hand-pumps and tube wells, while 27.18 million households (11 per cent) used well for drinking water. Around 4.93 million (2 percent) households made use of Spring, River, Canal, Tank, Pond & Lake etc. as sources of drinking water. Among the Rural households, 51.70 million households (31 percent) had access to tap; 87.15 million households (52 percent) had hand pumps/tubewells; while 22.33 million households (13 percent) accessed well for drinking water. Around 4.36 million households (3 percent) used Spring, River, Canal, Tank, Pond & Lake etc. for drinking water. Among Urban households, 55.70 million households (71 percent) had taps; 16.36 million households (21 percent) had hand pumps/tubewells; while 4.85 million households (6 percent) had access to well for drinking water. Around 0.54 million urban households (1 percent) had to depend upon Spring, River, Canal, Tank, Pond & Lake, etc. for drinking water.



5.2 Census 2011 reveals that at the national level, 114.92 million households (47 percent) had a drinking water source located within their premises, while 88.41 million households (36 percent) had a drinking water source located near their premises and 43.36 million households (17 percent) had a drinking water source located away from their premises. Among Rural households, 58.75 million (35 percent) had facility of drinking water located within the premises, while 72.05 million households (43 percent) had a drinking water source located near their premises and 37.01 million households (22 percent) had a drinking water source located away from their premises. In the case of Urban areas, 56.16 million households (71 percent) had drinking water source located within the premises, while 16.35 million households (21 percent) had drinking water source located near their premises and 60.34 million households (8 percent) had a drinking water source located away from their premises.

Households & Availability of Kitchen Facilities: (Table-17, Figure-17)

5.3 As per Census 2011, for the country as a whole, 137.59 million (56 percent) households had a kitchen facility within the house. This included 76.24 million Rural households (45 percent of total rural households) and 67.36 million Urban households (78 percent of total urban households). 30.48 million (12 percent) households cooked their meal in open space; this included 27.58 million Rural households (16 percent of total rural total households) and 2.90 million Urban households (3 percent of urban total households). 72.82 million households (31 percent) did not have a kitchen separately within the house, out of which 63.61 million Rural households (38 percent) and 14.21 million Urban households (18 percent) did not have a kitchen separately within the house.





5.4 As per census 2011, out of 246.69 million households, 103.68 million households (42 percent) had a bathroom facility; 40.44 million households (16 percent) had a bathroom facility enclosure without roof and 102.56 million households (42 percent) without a bathroom facility. Among the Rural households, 42.55 million households (25 percent) had a bathroom facility; 32.98 million households (20 percent) had a bathroom facility enclosure without roof and 92.29 million households (55 percent) without a bathroom facility. Among Urban households, 61.13 million households (77 percent) had a bathroom facility; 7.46 million households (9 percent) had a bathroom facility enclosure without roof and 10.27 million households (13 percent) without bathroom facility.



5.5 As per Census 2011, 44.73 million households (18 percent) had a closed drainage connectivity for waste water outlet; 81.42 million households (33 percent) had a open drainage connectivity for waste water outlet and 120.52 million households (49 percent) without drainage connectivity for waste water outlet. Among Rural households, 9.64 million households (6 percent) had a closed drainage connectivity for waste water outlet; 52.03 million households (31 percent) had a open drainage connectivity for waste water outlet and 106.14 million households (63 percent) without drainage connectivity for waste water outlet. Among Urban households, 35.10 million households (44 percent) had a closed drainage connectivity for waste water outlet; 29.39 million households (37 percent) had a open drainage connectivity for waste water outlet and 14.38 million households (18 percent) without drainage connectivity for waste water outlet.

Households and Availability of Latrine Facilities: (Table-20, Figure-20):

5.6 As per Census 2011, 115.74 million (47 percent) households at all India level had a latrine facility within the premises. Out of these, the share of Rural households was 51.57 million (31 percent of total rural households) and that of Urban households was 64.16 million (81 percent of total urban households).

Types of Latrine Facilities: (Table-20, Figure-20):


Out of the total 246.69 million households as per Census 2011, 89.85 million households (36 percent) had access to a water closet latrine, 23.28 million households (9 percent) had access to a pit latrine and 2.60 million (1 percent) households in India had access to other types of latrine. The remainder 130.96 million households (53 percent) had no access to a latrine facility within the house. Among the Rural households, 32.62 million (19 percent) had access to a water closet latrine, 17.68 million households (10 percent) had access to a pit latrine and 1.28 million households (0.8 percent) had access to other type of latrines. There were 116.25 million households in Rural areas, i.e. 69 percent having no latrine facility within the house. In the case of Urban households, 57.23 million households (73 percent) had access to a water closet latrine, 5.60 million households (7 percent) had access to a pit latrine and 1.33 million households

(2 percent) had access to other types of latrines. Urban households without a latrine facility numbered 14.70 million, i.e. 20 percent of total Urban households.


Households & Source of Lighting the House (Table-21, Figure-21):

5.7 Census 2011 reported that Electricity and Kerosene were the two main sources of lighting for 98 percent of the households in India. Around 165.90 million households (67 percent) had electricity as the source of lighting, while 74.54 million households (31 percent) were using kerosene for lighting their homes. While 1.59 million (0.6 percent) households were using solar energy and other oils together as source of lighting their homes, 1.16 (0.5 percent) million households were living without any kind of lighting for their homes. Data on availability of lighting facility for Rural and Urban households show that 92.81 million rural households (55 percent) use electricity as source of lighting, while 72.43 million of these households (43 percent) use kerosene as source of lighting. Around 1.33 million (0.7 percent) rural households had been using solar energy and other oil, as source of lighting, while 0.90 million households (0.5 percent) in rural area had no lighting facility. Around 73.08 million Urban households (93 percent) had electricity as source of lighting, while 5.11 million households (6 percent) had to depend on kerosene for lighting their home. There were only 0.26 million urban households (0.3 percent) using solar energy and other oils together as source of lighting, while 0.27 million urban households (0.3 percent) were living without lighting.

Figure-21**Households by Source of Lighting Facility - 2011**



Types of Fuel used for Cooking: (Table-22, Figure-22)

5.8 As per Census 2011 data on type of fuel used for cooking shows that firewood, crop residue, cow dung cake, coal, lignite and charcoal constituted the major source of fuel used for cooking in India. Households using firewood, crop residue, cow dung cake, coal, lignite and charcoal numbered 165.86 million (67 percent), followed by households using LPG at 70.42 million (28 percent) and kerosene at 7.16 million (3 percent). Among Rural households, those using firewood, crop residue, cow dung cake, coal, lignite and charcoal for cooking were 145.21 million (86 percent), followed by LPG-using households at 19.14 million (11 percent) and kerosene-using at 1.23 million (1 percent). In Urban areas, households using LPG for cooking numbered 51.29 million (65 percent), followed by firewood, crop residue, cow dung cake, coal, lignite and charcoal-user households of 20.64 million (26 percent) and kerosene-user households of 5.93 million (7 percent).


Availability of Banking Services (Table-23, Figure-23):



Figure-24 Households having each of the Specified Assets - 2011





Figure – 25 Houseless Population in India - 2001







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3 Housing Condition in India –NSSO Reports

1. NSSO Surveys

1.1 The National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO) conducts regular Sample Surveys on Housing Condition on quinquennial basis for the entire country. NSSO started collecting data relating to housing condition in India almost since its inception, i.e. 1954. Data on the structural aspects of dwelling units and basic housing amenities such as drinking water, bathroom, sewerage, latrines, lighting etc. are being collected through sample surveys conducted from time to time.

1.2 The recent NSSO survey reports available on Housing Condition include:

- i. Housing Condition in India 49th Round (Jan.1993-June 1993)
- ii. Housing Condition in India 58th Round (July to December 2002)
- iii. Housing Condition and Amenities in India, 65th Round 2008-09 (July2008-June 2009)

“Housing Condition and Amenities in India, 2008-09” is the latest Report presenting the result of the survey on housing condition from the NSS 65th round, covering the aspects of basic housing amenities available to households, characteristics and conditions of dwelling units, micro-environmental elements surrounding dwellings, and certain aspects of construction including cost of construction undertaken by the households.

2. Availability of Basic Amenities

Drinking Water Facility

2.1 The availability of drinking water is one of the most basic human needs. The study of drinking water facilities requires an analysis of access to different sources of drinking water and sufficiency of drinking water. The accessibility component has other aspects such as distance travelled to the source of drinking water and whether the water source is shared with other households or for exclusive use of the individual household.

Source of Drinking Water (Table-29, Figure-29):

2.2 Table-29 shows the pattern of use of different sources of drinking water by rural and urban households and the changes in the patterns of use of drinking water sources in different NSS rounds. The change in the pattern of usage over the period 1993 (49th round) to 2009 (65th round) is reflected in Table 30. The usage of safe drinking water, particularly tap water usage, has increased from 32.4 to 43.1 per cent over this period and the usage of well water has gone down to 9.3 per cent in 2009 from 25.7 per cent in 1993. One noticeable feature of urban households was the use of ‘bottled water’ as a major source of drinking water, which contributed 2.7 per cent of the urban households. It is also interesting to note that for the first time, the rural population has started rainwater harvesting in selected pockets of the country.



Distance from Source of Drinking Water (Table-30, Figure-30):


2.3 Table 30 presents the percentage of households having a drinking water source within and outside their premises both in rural and urban areas during three different survey periods. The percentage of households with the availability of drinking water within premises and outside premises but within 0.5 km of their premises is presented in for NSS 49th Round, 58th Round and 65th Round. Over the period of 1993 to 2008-09, in both rural and urban areas, there has been a considerable improvement in the availability of drinking water within premises, thus signifying that the percentage of households, who were required to access drinking water facility, has declined over the period. In the 49th Round, 34.30 per cent of the households in rural areas had a drinking water facility within the premises, which increased to 37.20 per cent in the 58th Round and to 40.50 percent in the 65th Round. On the other hand, in urban areas, 66.20 percent of households had drinking water facility within the premises, which increased to 70.30 percent in the 58th Round and to 74.50 percent in the 65th Round. This Table also shows the steady decline in the proportion of households with drinking water facility outside premises. In 49th Round, in rural areas, 54.40 per cent households had drinking water facility outside the premises but within a distance of 0.2 km. This situation improved in the 65th Round, with only 48.00 percent of the households having a drinking water facility outside premises but within a distance of 0.2 km of their premises.


2.4 Table-31 shows the percentage distribution of households with different types of bathroom facilities reported by NSS 49th, 58th and 65th Rounds (from 1993 to 2008-09). Households with no bathroom facility have decreased during this period for both rural and urban areas; further a higher percentage of households were found to have bathroom facility in 65th Round, 2008-09. In 65th Round, in rural areas only 12.50 percent households had an attached bathroom facility, while 23.10 percent of the households had a detached bathroom facility and 64.40 percent of rural households had no bathroom facility. In urban areas 48.00 percent of the households had an attached bathroom facility, while 30.50 percent households had a detached bathroom facility and around 21.50 percent urban households had no bathroom facility. At the all India level, around 51.70 percent households had no bathroom facility, while 23.00 percent households had an attached bathroom facility. 25.3 percent of households at the all India level had a detached bathroom facility.


2.5 Table-32 shows the distribution of households by the types of latrines used. There is a considerable reduction in the proportion of households with no latrine facility in both rural and urban areas over the time period of the surveys between 1993 to 2008-09. In the rural areas, the proportion of households with no latrine facility declined by nearly 21 percentage points between 1993 and 2008-09, 85.8 percent households had no latrine facility in 1993 which decreased to about 65.2 percent in 2008-09. In urban areas, on the other hand, while 30.6 percent households had no latrine facility in 1993, only 11.3 percent households were deprived of this facility by 2008-09.

Type of Access to Latrine Facility (Table-33, Figure-33):

2.6 Both in rural and urban areas, the proportion of households with exclusive use of latrine facility increased during the period from 1993 to 2009. In Rural areas, the increase was from 10.2 percent households in 49th Round (Jan.1993-June 1993) to 27.9 percent in 65th Round (July 2008-June 2009), while in urban areas the increase was from 40.4 percent to 58.1 percent during this period. The proportion of households with a shared latrine increased in both rural and urban areas, but the increase was more pronounced in rural areas than in urban areas. In rural areas, only 2.1 percent of the households used a shared latrine in 49th Round, while the figure increased to 5.7 percent of the households in 65th round. In urban areas the use of shared latrine increased from 22.7 percent in 49th Round to 24.1 percent in 65th Round. The share of public/community latrine uses in rural areas was 1.3 percent and 1.2 percent respectively in the 49th Round and the 65th Round, while in urban areas the share was reported to be 6.5 percent during the 65th Round.



In rural areas, the percentage of households having no latrine facility declined from 85.8 percent in 49th Round to 65.2 percent of households in 65th Round. In urban areas, almost 31 percent of households had no access to latrine in 49th Round but this declined sharply to 11 percent in 65th Round.

Availability of Electricity Facility (Table- 34, Figure- 34):

2.7 Electricity is considered to be an important facility to the households and has bearing on the quality of life of the people. Table 34 shows the relative position of electricity usage for domestic purposes in different NSS surveys from the 49th to the 65th Round. A comparison of the NSS survey reports on housing conditions reveals that the use of electricity for lighting in rural areas has substantially increased from a mere 37.3 per cent during 49th Round, to about 66 percent in 65th Round. During 65th Round (2008-09), at the all India level, 75.00 percent of the households had electricity for domestic use, with significant rural-urban differences. While in rural areas, 66.00 percent households had electricity for domestic use, in urban areas, this proportion was 96.10 percent.



Households with Three Basic Facilities: Drinking Water within Premises, Latrine and Electricity (Table- 35, Figure- 35):

2.8 Table-35 shows the percentage distribution of households with all three facilities, viz. drinking water within premises, latrine and electricity. It is evident that in both rural and urban areas, the proportion of households with all three facilities has increased considerably. During 49th Round, 5.6 percent of the households in rural areas had access to all the three facilities; this trebled in 65th Round to cover 18.4 percent of the households. In urban areas, the proportion of households, which enjoyed all three facilities, increased from 47.6 percent in 49th Round to 67.5 percent households in 65th Round.



3. Households with Different Types of Tenure Status (Table- 36):

Table-36 shows the distribution of households by different tenurial status reported during NSS 49th Round, 58th Round and 65th Round. During 2008-09, the majority of the households, in both rural and urban areas were residing in owned dwellings - about 95 percent in rural areas and 62 percent in urban areas. Hired dwellings (including with written contract and without written contract) also shared a significant proportion of household tenure types as 3 percent of rural households and 30 percent of urban households lived in hired dwellings. Residing in employer's quarter was more of an urban phenomenon, with nearly 5 percent of the urban households residing in their employer's quarters as against less than 1 per cent of rural households. Over a period of time from 1993 (49th Round) to 2008-09 (65th Round), some changes in the tenurial status were observed in both the rural and the urban areas. The proportion of households with own dwelling has shown an increase during this period. In rural areas, during 1993 nearly 93 percent households had their own dwelling, which increased to nearly 95 percent in 2008-09 and for urban areas the share of own dwelling increased from 57 percent in 1993 to nearly 62 percent in 2008-09. Over this period of time, hired accommodation retained a significant share of the type of tenure of urban households while the percentage of urban households having employer's quarter lost its share.

4. Characteristics of Dwelling Unit:

4.1 Type of Structure (Table- 37, Figure- 36):

The type of structure of building is an important indicator for studying prevailing housing conditions in the country. The physical condition of the structure of a building has been classified into pucca, semi-pucca and kutchha, based on the materials used in the construction of roof and wall of the dwelling unit. Table 37 shows the distribution of rural and urban households by type of structure of the dwelling unit reported during the 49th, 58th and 65th Round NSS surveys.



Type of Dwelling Unit (Table- 38, Figure- 37):

4.2 Table-38 shows the distribution of households living in houses by type of use reported in NSS 49th Round, 58th Round and 65th Round of survey. In the NSS 65th Round, 92.1 percent of the rural households and 91.1 percent of the urban households lived in houses used exclusively for residential purposes. However, residential-cum commercial use of houses was more prominent in urban areas than in rural areas: about 7.6 percent of the urban households lived in houses that were used for residential-cum-commercial purposes against about 4.8 percent for rural areas.




4.3 In the NSS 65th Round, information on condition of the dwelling units was collected, for the first time. The condition of the dwelling unit was considered to be good if the structure did not require any immediate repair, whereas if the structure required immediate minor repair but not major repair, it was considered to be in satisfactory condition. On the other hand, if the structure required major repair without which it might be unsafe for habitation or required to be demolished and rebuilt, it was considered to be in bad condition. Table-39 shows that in urban areas, a higher percentage of households lived in structures, which were in good condition when compared to rural areas. Nearly 54.20 per cent of urban households lived in structures that were in good condition, as against 31.00 percent of rural households. At all-India level, around 46.80 percent of households lived in houses with satisfactory structural condition. On the other hand, nearly 18.20 percent of rural households lived in houses with bad structural condition compared to 8.40 percent of urban households.

Construction for Residential Purpose (Table- 40, Figures- 39 & 40):

4.4 In the NSS 65th Round, information was collected on various facets of construction activities undertaken by the households for residential purpose during last 365 days. Residential construction undertaken is discussed with respect to two features, viz. the proportion of households who undertook residential constructions and the average number of residential constructions undertaken per household. Table-40 shows that a higher percentage of households in rural areas undertook construction than households in urban areas; nearly 10.70 percent households in rural areas and 3.90 percent in urban areas undertook construction and completed the same during the last 365 days of the survey. Similarly 1.20 percent of households in rural areas and 0.50 percent in urban areas undertook construction, which were still in-progress during the last 365 days of the survey. Table-40 also provides information on the average cost per construction. It is seen that average cost of completed constructions was much lower than that in constructions which were still in-progress (i.e. construction activity not completed during the last 365 days of the survey). Further, the average cost of construction in rural areas was almost half of that in urban areas. While the average cost per completed construction was Rs.27,000 in rural areas, it was Rs.58,000 in urban areas. The average cost of in-progress constructions was Rs.82,000 in rural areas as against Rs. 1,53,000 in urban areas.





Cost of Constructions during Last 365 Days in 65th Round (Table- 41, Figure- 41):

4.5 Table-41 presents the break-up of the cost of construction by different components, viz. material cost, labour cost and other costs (service charges, etc.). It is evident that in both rural and urban areas, cost of pucca materials constituted the majority of the cost of construction, followed by labour cost. Around 65.80 percent of the total cost of construction in rural areas and 68.10 percent of the total cost of construction in urban areas was for pucca material. In rural areas, nearly 23.00 percent of the total cost of construction was spent on labour, while share of labour charges in total cost of constructions was nearly 23.70 percent in urban areas.





Sources of Drinking Water for Different Social Groups (Table- 43):

5.2 The percentage distribution of households of different social groups by first major sources of drinking water at all India level is presented in Table-43. During 2008-09, in rural areas, tubewells/handpumps were the major sources of drinking water for all the social groups; 58.90 percent of the SC households depended on tubewells/handpumps as the major source of drinking water against 56.10 percent of ST households, 51.60 percent of OBC households and 55.60 percent of households of ‘others’ category. In urban areas, a different pattern emerges. Among all the social groups, the proportion of households who depend on tap was lowest for ST households (68.50 percent) and the same was highest among the households of ‘others’ category (78.40 percent) for urban areas. On the other hand, tubewells/handpumps served the highest proportion of SC households (23.20 percent) and lowest proportion of ‘others’ category households (14.40 percent) for urban areas.


5.3 Table- 44 shows the percentage distribution of households by availability of types of bathroom for different social groups. In rural areas the highest proportion of non-availability of bathroom facility was seen for SC households (76.8 per cent), followed closely by ST households (74.1 per cent), while the lowest at 48.6 per cent was for the ‘Others’ category households. In the urban areas too, lowest percentage of households in the ‘Others’ category had no bathroom facility (14.10 per cent); the highest proportion was in SC households (37.10 per cent). In both rural and urban areas, the availability of an attached bathroom facility was highest among the ‘Others’ category, the percentage being 19.10 in rural areas and 59.4 in urban areas. However, in rural areas, the availability of an attached bathroom facility was lowest among the ST households (5.7 per cent) while in urban areas it was lowest among SC households (30.30 per cent).

Availability of Latrine Facility for Different Social Groups (Table- 45):

5.4 Table-45 shows the percentage distribution of households by availability of latrine facility for different social groups. In rural areas, SC households had the highest proportion with no latrine facility (76.30 percent), followed closely by ST households (75.00 percent), with the households belonging to the 'Others' category had lowest proportion of no latrine facility (43.10 percent). The pattern is similar in urban areas also: SC households had the highest proportion with no latrine facility (22.70 percent), closely followed by ST households (21.10 percent) and for the 'Others' category of households, the proportion was the lowest at 4.10 per cent. Access to septic tanks/ flush latrine facility was found to be more common among the 'Others' households in both rural and urban areas: 28.60 percent in rural areas and 85.20 percent in urban areas.


5.5 Table-46 shows the percentage distribution of households by availability of electricity facility for different social groups. In both rural and urban areas, the proportion of ST households who had electricity for domestic use was the lowest followed by SC households. In rural areas, 57.30 percent of ST households had electricity for domestic use against 73.60 percent of the ‘Others’ category households. In urban areas 91.50 percent of ST households had electricity against 98.10 percent of the ‘Others’ category of households.

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4 Slums in India

Slum Statistics in India

The nodal agencies in Government of India for collection, collation and dissemination of statistics relating to Slum Population condition in India are:

- (i) Office of the Registrar General and Census Commissioner of India (RGI); and
- (ii) National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO).

Office of the Registrar General and Census Commissioner (RGI)

Office of the Registrar General and Census Commissioner (RGI) collects and publishes population statistics as part of the Population Census being undertaken by them every ten years. For the first time the RGI published the estimates of slum population in India based on 2001 Census. This primarily confined to cities and towns having more than 50,000 populations. Subsequently, towns with population between 20,000 and 50,000 were also considered for slum population enumeration. Census data relating to slums in the 2001 throw up some interesting light on the slum population characteristics in India. It reflects the problems inherent in not having a uniform definition of slums, lack of a proper listing of slum settlements with the urban bodies and district authorities concerned and lack of proactive action by States/local authorities in declaring/notifying slums. The 2001 Census data is partial due to exclusion of towns with less than 20,000 population, and slum clusters, which are not formally or informally recognized if the population was less than 300. Census 2001 data therefore does not provide all information on slums in 2001.

3. National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO)

3.1 The second most important data source on slums is NSSO. NSSO is the nodal authority in the country to conduct major socio-economic surveys. So far NSSO has conducted four surveys on slums, which provide data on estimated number of slums, households, basic amenities in slums, etc. The NSSO collects data on slums as part of its survey on Housing Conditions and Slums.

3.2 The first Survey on Slum during 31st Round, namely “Conditions of Slum Area in Cities” was conducted in 1977 and was restricted to Class I cities. The second survey “Slums in India” was conducted in 1993; slum data was collected separately for rural and urban areas. The third survey was conducted exclusively for urban slum in 2002 namely “Conditions of Urban Slum”. The fourth and latest i.e. the 65th Round Slum Survey was conducted in 2008-09. So far four exclusive Slum Surveys have been conducted by NSSO; however the 31st round results cannot be compared with the rest of three survey results, as it was restricted to Class-I cities only. Being sample survey, NSSO data have their own limitations. The latest survey on slums has been conducted in 2008-09 and the findings are restricted to ten major states in India.

4. 2001 Slum Census Data

Size and Distribution of Slum Population-Census-2001

4.1 A total of 52.4 million people living in 10.2 million households have been enumerated in slums of 1743 cities/towns spread across 26 States and Union Territories in the 2001 Census of India. The non-slum population was 233.75 million. The slum population constitutes 5.1 per cent of the total population of the country. The slum population in the country as a whole enumerated constitutes 18.3 percent of the total urban population of all the States and Union Territories and 81.7 percent of urban population were non-slum population in 2001. The slum population was 23.5 per cent of the total population of the 1743 cities/towns having above 20,000 populations and reporting slums. Table- 47 gives population and slum profiles of the country. Figures- 45 and 46 provide slum and non-slum population details as per Census 2001 in India.


Figure- 45 Slum and Non Slum Population in India-2001

Note: Non Slum Population for the entire Urban India 2001


Figure- 46 Percentage of Slum and Non-Slum Population in India, 2001

4.2 The distribution of the 1743 slum-reporting cities (having a population above 20,000) among States and Union Territories is presented in Figure- 47. Among the States, Tamil Nadu has the largest number of cities and towns (242) reporting slum population followed by Uttar Pradesh (238), Maharashtra (176), Karnataka (154), Madhya Pradesh (142) and Andhra Pradesh (118). On the other hand, in eight States/Union Territories, namely, Rajasthan, Bihar, West Bengal, Gujarat, Punjab, Orissa, Haryana and Chhattisgarh, slums have been reported from minimum of 34 cities and maximum 93 towns. In the remaining States/Uts, the number ranges from 1 city in Chandigarh to 23 cities in Jharkhand.


Figure- 47 State-wise Number of Slum Reporting Towns/Cities in India-2001


4.3 Slums in the 176 towns of Maharashtra account for 11.98 million people, which is 22.9 percent of the total slum population of the country. This is followed by Andhra Pradesh (6.3 million), Uttar Pradesh (5.8 million), West Bengal (4.7 million) and Tamil Nadu (4.2 million). In fact, these 5 states namely Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal, TamilNadu account for about two- thirds (62.8 percent) of the total slum population of the country. Other nine States/Union Territories namely Punjab, Haryana, NCT of Delhi, Rajasthan, Gujarat, Karnataka, Chhattisgarh, Orissa and Madhya Pradesh have reported more than 1 million slum dwellers in its cities/towns in 2001. Bihar, one of the major states in India, has reported just 0.82 million slum population – representing a case of under-reporting. All North-Eastern states including hilly states reported less than half a million slum population. Figure-48 shows total slum population enumerated by States and Union Territories in 2001.

4.4 The percentage distribution of the total 52.4 million slum population reported in all 1743 (640+1103) towns/cities among States and Union Territories are presented in Figure- 49. Among the states, Maharashtra alone accommodates 22.9 percent the slum population of the country; followed by Andhra Pradesh with 12 percent and Uttar Pradesh with 11 percent of slum population in the country. In addition, towns of West Bengal, Tamil Nadu, Punjab, Haryana, NCT of Delhi, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, Rajasthan, Karnataka, Chhattisgarh and Orissa, each have reported slum population in the range of 2 to 10 percent.


Figure- 49 Percentage Distribution of Slum Population in States/UT's as per Census 2001

4.5 As a percentage of the total urban population, Andhra Pradesh has the highest proportion of slum population (30.1%) followed by Maharashtra (29.1%), Haryana (27.5%), Chhattisgarh (26.2%), Meghalaya (24.1%), Madhya Pradesh (23.7%) and West Bengal (20.8). In thirteen States/Union Territories of Orissa, Punjab, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, NCT of Delhi, Tamil Nadu, Jammu and Kashmir, Puducherry, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Chandigarh, Karnataka, Rajasthan and Gujarat, 10-20 per cent of the urban population lives in slums. Kerala has the lowest percentage of slum population in the urban areas at 0.9 % while Assam (2.6%) and Goa (2.7%) have a very low proportion of the slum population.

Slum Population in Million Plus Cities

4.6 About 17.7 million people live in slums in the metropolitan cities with population more than one million, which is about 33.8 per cent of the total slum population in the country reported at the 2001 Census. In absolute numbers, Municipal Corporation area of Greater Mumbai has the highest slum population of around 6.5 million, followed by NCT of Delhi (1.9 million) and Kolkata (1.5 million). The slum areas of Surat, Hyderabad, Chennai and Nagpur have more than half a million population each. Except for Patna (3,592) and Kalyan Dombivli (34,860), all million plus cities reported considerable slum population in 2001. The slum population in Patna and Kalyan Dombivli was based on what was reported by the authorities as notified or declared. Patna represented a case of gross under-reporting.

4.7 About 54.1 per cent of population of Greater Mumbai Municipal Corporation lives in slums, which is the highest among all cities, followed by Faridabad (46.5%) and Meerut (44.1%). The slum population is more than a quarter of the total population in Kolkata (32.5%), Nagpur (35.9%) and Thane (27.8%). Ludhiana (22.5%) and Surat (20.9%) have more than 20 per cent of their population living in slums.

4.8 The concentration of slum population in the metropolitan cities is evident from the fact that 33.8 per cent of the total slum population of the country resides in these cities. Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai alone accounts for about one eighth (12.4%) of the total slum population reported in the country and more than one third (36.6%) of the total slum population of the million plus cities (Table-48):

Four Municipal Corporations, namely Greater Mumbai, Kolkata, NCT of Delhi and Chennai together account for 20.0 per cent of the total slum population of the country and around 60 per cent of the total slum population of the million plus cities as depicted in Table- 48 above.

5. Report of Committee on Slum Statistics/Census

5.1 A Committee on Slum Statistics/Census was constituted by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Poverty Alleviation under the chairmanship of Dr Pronab Sen, the then Secretary, Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation and Chief Statistician of India, to look into various aspects of slum statistics/census and issues regarding the conduct of the Slum Census 2001. The Committee submitted its report in August 2010. The same has been accepted by the Government of India. On careful consideration of the various alternatives available and keeping in mind the need to use a definition which is suitable for public policy purposes, the Committee decided to adopt the definition used by the NSSO as its working concept. To reiterate, the Committee defined Slums as;

“A Slum is a compact settlement of at least 20 households with a collection of poorly built tenements, mostly of temporary nature, crowded together usually with inadequate sanitary and drinking water facilities in unhygienic conditions.”

5.2 The estimates of slum population in India for the year 2001 and projected slum population up to year 2017 based on the Report of the Committee on Slum Statistics/Census are shown in Table-49 and 50.

Figure-51 India's: Estimated Slum Population for all 5161 Towns in 2001



Figure-52 India's: Projected Slum Population during 2011 – 2017




5**Approach to Urban Housing & Poverty Alleviation**

The Government of India has adopted a two-pronged approach to deal with the problems of slums and urban poverty in the country: These include the provision of basic services and shelter to the urban poor and addressing their concerns of skill development, employment and income generation. The first formal attempt to deal with urban poverty started in 1958 with the adoption of community development approach in cities and towns through Urban Community Development (UCD) pilot project. This was following the successful adoption of the community development approach in rural areas.

Table- 53 gives an account of the various initiatives undertaken by the Government of India during different Five Year Plans till the 11th Plan:

1.2 The initiatives of the Government of India in recent years, including those in the 11th Five Year Plan to address the issues of slums and urban poverty – affordable housing, basic amenities and lack of skill and employment opportunities for the urban poor are summarized as follows:

2 Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM)

2.1 Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM) aims at focusing attention on the integrated development of urban infrastructure and services with an emphasis on the provision of affordable housing and basic amenities to the urban poor, including water supply, drainage, sewerage, solid waste management, community facilities etc. The Mission has four components: Urban Infrastructure & Governance (UIG) and Basic Services to the Urban Poor (BSUP), applicable to 65 cities of national importance and Urban Infrastructure Development Scheme for Small and Medium Towns (UIDSSMT) and Integrated Housing & Slum Development Programme (IHSDP) applicable to other cities and towns. UIG and UIDSSMT focus on

the development of city-wide infrastructure, whereas BSUP and IHSDP focus on housing and basic amenities to the urban poor, especially slum-dwellers. The earlier schemes of National Slum Development Programme (NSDP) and Valmiki Ambedkar Awas Yojana (VAMBAY) have been subsumed under IHSDP.

2.2 The broad objectives of Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM) are:

- Planned urban development;
- Integrated development of urban infrastructural services;
- Effective linkages between asset creation and asset management;
- Ensuring adequate investment of funds in cities;
- Scaling up delivery of civic amenities and provision of utilities with emphasis on universal access to the urban poor;
- Taking up urban renewal programme, i.e., redevelopment of inner (old) cities area to reduce congestion; and
- Provision of basic services to the urban poor including security of tenure at affordable prices, where possible *in situ*, improved housing, water supply, sanitation, education, health and social security.

2.3 The Basic Services to the Urban Poor (BSUP) and Integrated Housing & Slum Development Programme (IHSDP) components of JNNURM aim at the integrated provision of affordable housing and basic amenities to the urban poor, with focus on slums. They contemplate the following key reforms relating to pro-poor governance:

- Earmarking at least 20-25% of developed land in all housing projects (both public and private agencies) for EWS/LIG category with a system of cross-subsidization;
- Internal earmarking within local body budgets for basic services to the urban poor; and
- Implementation of 7-Point Charter, i.e. provision of basic services to the urban poor, including security of tenure at affordable prices, improved housing, water supply, sanitation and ensuring delivery of already existing universal services of the Government for education, health and social security within the Mission period (2005-12) as per agreed timelines.

The essence of the above reforms are: (i) enabling the urban poor to have access to urban land and not squeezing them out of the urban land market in the face of sky-rocketing land prices; (ii) facilitating a dedicated budget/fund to be created at the city/state level to ensure a steady flow of resources for urban poverty alleviation and slum upgradation, including the provision of land and housing to the poor; and (iii) providing basic entitlements and services to be provided to the urban poor based on agreed milestones and deliberately planned efforts to develop “inclusive” cities. These reforms are to be undertaken in conjunction with other reforms aimed at creating an enabling framework of good urban governance for planned and sustainable development of cities and towns.

3 Swarna Jayanti Shahari Rozgar Yojana

3.1 The Swarna Jayanti Shahari Rozgar Yojana (SJSRY), which has been under implementation since 1997, has been comprehensively revamped. The revised scheme came into operation from 1st April 2009. The scheme strives to provide support for employment of the unemployed and under-employed urban poor, through encouraging the setting up of self-employment ventures, skill development and also providing wage employment by utilizing their labour for the construction of socially and economically useful public assets.

3.2 The objectives of the revamped SJSRY are:

- Addressing urban poverty alleviation through gainful employment for the urban unemployed or underemployed poor by encouraging them to set up self-employment ventures (individual or group), with support for their sustainability or undertake wage employment;
- Supporting skill development and training programmes to enable the urban poor to have access to employment opportunities opened up by the market or undertake self-employment

- Empowering the community to tackle the issues of urban poverty through suitable self-managed community structures like Neighbourhood Groups (NHGs), Neighbourhood Committees (NHC), Community Development Society (CDS), etc.

3.3 The revised SJSRY scheme has the following five components; the targets under these components are as follows:

- (i). Urban Self Employment Programme (USEP) - Targeted at individuals among the urban poor for the setting up of micro-enterprises;
- (ii). Urban Women Self-help Programme (UWSP) - Targeted at urban poor women self-help groups for setting up of group-enterprises and providing them assistance through a revolving fund for thrift & credit/self-help group activities;
- (iii). Skill Training for Employment Promotion amongst Urban Poor (STEP-UP) - Targeted at urban poor for imparting quality skills training to the urban poor so as to enhance their employability for better salaried/wage employment offered by the market or self-employment;
- (iv). Urban Wage Employment Programme (UWEP) - Targeted at assisting the urban poor by utilizing their labour for the construction of socially and economically useful public assets, in towns having population less than 5 lakhs as per 1991 census; and
- (v). Urban Community Development Network (UCDN) - Targeted at assisting the urban poor in organizing themselves into self-managed community structures so as to gain collective strength to address the issues of poverty facing them and participate in the effective implementation of urban poverty alleviation programmes.

4. National Policy on Urban Street Vendors

4.1 In 2004, the Government of India formulated a National Policy on Urban Street Vendors, which aimed at recognizing the positive contribution of street vendors to the society and also the promotion of street vending as an urban poverty alleviation measure. Considering the difficulties in implementation of the 2004 Policy and taking into account the views of the National Commission on Enterprises in the Unorganised Sector (NCEUS), 2007 report and that the Policy required a supporting legal framework to be effective, the Ministry of Housing & Urban Poverty Alleviation has formulated the Revised National Policy on Urban Street Vendors 2009 and Model Street Vendors (Protection of Livelihood and Regulation of Street Vending) Bill, 2009. The Policy has come to effect since 1.4.2009.

4.2 It is envisaged that the following actions will be undertaken at the State level in pursuance of the National Policy on Urban Street Vendors 2009 and Model Law on Street Vendors 2009:

- Enacting a Law on Urban Street Vending, taking into account the Model Bill, with the overall interest of the vendors kept in view, suiting local conditions and also respecting any court decisions that may impinge on the issue;
- Taking steps to restructure Master Planning laws and City Master/Zonal/Local Area Plans to make them ‘inclusive’ and addressing the requirements of space for street vending as an important urban activity through “norms” for reservation of space for street vendors in accordance with their current population and projected growth;
- Ensuring the demarcation of ‘Restriction-free Vending Zones’, ‘Restricted Vending Zones’, ‘No-vending Zones’ and ‘Mobile Vending Areas’ in every city/town, taking into account the natural propensity of street vendors to locate in certain places at certain times in response to the patterns of demand for their goods/services or the formation of “natural markets”, traffic congestion and other factors in view;
- Requiring Urban Local Bodies/Development Authorities to allocate sufficient space for temporary ‘Vendors’ Markets’ such as Weekly Haats, Rehri Markets, Night Bazaars, Festival Bazaars, Food Streets/Street Food Marts etc., with suitable timing restrictions;
- Providing a framework for the registration of street vendors, issuance of identity cards and regulation of street vendors, including the constitution of Town Vending Committees in all cities/towns and, if considered appropriate, at the level of wards/groups of wards, representing the local authority, planning authority, police, associations of street vendors, resident welfare associations, civil society organizations such as NGOs, CBOs, professional groups, trade and commerce associations, scheduled banks and eminent citizens;
- Facilitating a comprehensive, digitalized photo census/survey/GIS mapping through competent professional institutions/agencies to build a robust database and information system on street vendors in every city/town for the purpose of granting registration to street vendors, issuing identity cards and leasehold rights for the use of

- vending spaces/stalls;
- Formulating a scheme for street vendors to enable them to earn an honest livelihood without harassment from officials and with access to civic facilities, health care schemes, education and skills training, credit and insurance, social security, rehabilitation of child vendors, promotion of Vendors' Organisations and maintenance of health and hygiene in vending places and vendors' markets;
 - Establishing a State Nodal Office for coordinating the implementation of the National Policy, maintenance of database, formulation and implementation of programmes for the benefit of street vendors, addressing the grievances of street vendors and reporting to the Government of India from time to time.

5. National Urban Housing & Habitat Policy 2007

5.1 The Ministry of Housing and Urban Poverty Alleviation has formulated the National Urban Housing & Habitat Policy, 2007 (NUHHP-2007) which primarily aims at providing a framework for provision of housing and basic infrastructure facilities to Economically Weaker Sections (EWS)/ Low Income Groups (LIG) and other sections of the society at affordable cost. The salient features of NUHHP-2007 are:

- Target at Affordable Urban Housing for All with special emphasis on the urban poor, especially Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes/Backward Classes/ Minorities and on empowerment of Women;
- Lay emphasis on inclusive urban planning and increasing supply of land for affordable housing, removing legal impediments, using spatial incentives like additional Floor Area Ratio (FAR), Transferable Development Rights (TDR), etc., accelerating flow of funds, promoting healthy environment, effective solid waste management, use of renewable sources of energy and adoption of participatory approach;
- Encouraging Integrated Townships and Special Economic Zones that are inclusive;
- Reserving 10-15% of land in every new public/private housing projects or 20-25% Floor Area Ratio (FAR), whichever is greater for EWS/LIG housing through appropriate spatial incentives;
- Public-Private-Partnerships (PPP): The private sector to undertake land assembly within the purview of Master Plans with focus on inclusion. Action Plans for urban Slum-dwellers and special package for Cooperative Housing, Labour Housing and Employees Housing to be prepared.
- Accord primacy to the provision of shelter to urban poor at their present location or near their work place with emphasis on in-situ slum rehabilitation; relocation to be considered only in specific cases.
- Micro-finance institutions to be promoted at state level to expedite flow of housing finance to urban poor.
- Focus on detailed city maps to be prepared based on GIS, aerial survey and ground verification. Efforts should be on encouraging the use of proven cost-effective technology and building materials, developing mass rapid transit system at sub-regional level, and creating green cover in and habitats cities for balanced ecological development.

5.2 NHHUP-2007 envisages that the States/UTs would develop a “Habitat Infrastructure Action Plan” for all cities with a population of over one lakh. It also envisages that they prepare 10-year perspective plan for housing of EWS/LIG. Encouragement and support are to be provided by the Central Government to State Governments for the preparation of State Urban Housing and Habitat Policy and Action Plan. State/UT policy is required to provide a road map for institutional, legal and financial reforms to promote affordable housing to all, especially to the urban poor.

6. Integrated Low Cost Sanitation Scheme (ILCS)

6.1 Low cost sanitation is seen as an important solution to the dehumanizing practice of manual scavenging. The Integrated Low Cost Sanitation Scheme (ILCS) aims at the conversion of individual dry latrines into pour-flush latrines, thereby liberating manual scavengers from the age-old, obnoxious practice of manually carrying the night soil. The scheme has recently been revised to implement it more effectively. The focus of the scheme is on conversion of dry latrines and construction of new latrines for latrine-less households so as to address the issues of sanitation in cities and towns.

6.2 Upper ceiling cost of Rs. 10,000/- has been provided for the complete unit of a two-pit pour flush individual latrine with superstructure (excluding states falling in difficult / hilly areas). For states falling in the category of difficult and hilly areas, an extra cost of 25% has been provided for each two-pit pour flush latrine. The scheme is limited to EWS households only and does not entail a loan component.

7 Affordable Housing in Partnership (AHP)

7.1 A scheme for Affordable Housing in Partnership (AHP) has been launched in 2009 as part of the existing Sub-Mission of Basic Services to the Urban Poor (BSUP) under the Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM). The scheme is in response to the recognition of the constraints on supply of housing for the economically poor categories and is aimed at incentivizing land assembly for affordable housing for the urban poor in various kinds of partnerships. It also intends to provide a stimulus to economic activities through the multiplier effects of housing on other sectors of the economy.

7.2 The scheme of AHP has an outlay of Rs. 5,000 crores for the 11th Plan and a target of construction of one million houses for Economically Weaker Section (EWS)/Low Income Group (LIG)/Middle Income Group (MIG) categories with at least 25% for EWS category. The scheme aims at partnership between various agencies: Government/Parastatals/ Urban Local Bodies/ Developers for realizing the goal of affordable housing for all and facilitating the creation of inclusive habitats.

Interest Subsidy Scheme for Housing the Urban Poor (ISHUP)

8.1 The interest Subsidy Scheme for Housing the Urban Poor (ISHUP), launched in 2008-09, seeks to provide a subsidy of 5 per cent per annum on interest on loans up to Rs 1 lakh taken for housing purposes by the urban poor, admissible over the full period of the loan. The scheme aims at leveraging the flow of institutional finance for the EWS

(with monthly income of up to Rs 5,000) and LIG (with monthly income between Rs 5,001 and Rs 10,000). EWS and LIG households can avail an affordable housing loan for the purchase of house or for the construction of new house under the scheme. Beneficiary borrowers may choose fixed or floating rates. An additional 1% p.a. (maximum) will be permitted to be charged by banks/Housing Finance Companies (HFCs) if fixed rate loans are extended which will be subject to review after a minimum period of 5 years. Mortgage of the dwelling unit is to be accepted as the primary security under ISHUP. There would be no collateral security/third party guarantee for loans up to and inclusive of Rs. 1 lakh, excluding group guarantee. No levy of prepayment charges would be permitted.

8.2 Under ISHUP, the Net Present Value (NPV) subsidy is given to the lenders on an up-front and quarterly basis. The NPV subsidy to the lender will be deducted from the principal loan amount of the borrower, who will then have to pay interest to the Bank/Housing Finance Institution (HFI) at an agreed document rate for the whole duration of the loan. The advantages of this method are as under:

- The interest subsidy directly accrues to the benefit of the borrower upfront reducing his principal outstanding amount;
- The EMI for any beneficiary type is lower than in a situation where the interest subsidy is disbursed through the loan period quarterly;
- The transactional complexity of administering and accounting of provision of subsidy disbursal through quarterly loan periods as well as cost involved for the PLIs claiming subsidy periodically and National Housing Bank (NHB) / HUDCO on behalf of the Government of India effecting payments is reduced;
- The beneficial impact of the upfront subsidy on the acceptability of borrowers should be higher than in the case of periodical subsidy payment;
- The lenders prefer the upfront adjustment mechanism not only for reasons of administrative convenience but also for facilitating credit risk evaluation. This is because the borrower's equity in the house goes up or the loan-to-value ratio comes down. This should also facilitate greater coverage of borrowers.

9. Rajiv Awas Yojana

9.1 The President of India has announced a new scheme called Rajiv Awas Yojana (RAY) on June 4, 2009 for the slum-dwellers and urban poor, aimed at ushering in a 'Slum-free India' by encouraging States/Union Territories to tackle the problem of slums in a definitive manner. RAY calls for a multi-prolonged approach focusing on:

- Bringing existing slums within the formal system and enabling them to avail of the same level of basic amenities as the rest of the town;
- Redressing the failures of the formal system that lie behind the creation of slums and squatter settlements; and
- Tackling the shortages of urban land and housing that keep shelter out of reach of the urban poor and force them to resort to extra-legal solutions in a bid to retain their sources of livelihood and employment.

Rajiv Awas Yojana would dovetail the schemes of Affordable Housing in Partnership and Interest Subsidy for Housing the Urban Poor. It would extend support to States that are willing to assign property rights to people living in slum areas. Property right need not be land; it could preferably be dwelling space.

9.2 As with JNNURM, the goals of RAY will be driven and incentivised by the provision of central support for slum redevelopment and construction of affordable housing conditional to a set of reforms necessary for urban development to become inclusive.

9.3 As part of the preparatory activities for Rajiv Awas Yojana, the Government of India has launched a scheme called Slum-free City Planning Scheme with a view to supporting States and Urban Local Bodies in activities like slum survey, Slum MIS, GIS mapping of slums, GIS-MIS integration and preparation of Slum-free City and State Plans.

10 12th Five-Year Plan: Strategy

10.1 The 12th Five Year Plan has adopted ‘inclusive growth’ as the dominant paradigm for India’s development. The monitorable socio-economic targets for the 12th Five Year Plan, set out by the Planning Commission as part of the inclusive growth strategy, include the following:

- Real GDP Growth Rate of 8.2 percent.
- Agriculture Growth Rate of 4.0 percent.
- Manufacturing Growth Rate of 10.0 percent.
- Accelerate the growth rate of GDP from 8% to 9% and then maintain GDP growth at 8.2 % in the 12th Plan.
- Increase the agricultural GDP growth rate to 4% per year to ensure a broader spread of benefits;
- Generate 50 million new work opportunities in the non-farm sector and provide skill training to equivalent numbers.
- Head Count Ratio of consumption poverty to be reduced by 10 percentage points over the preceding estimates.

As may be seen, employment creation, reduction in unemployment, raising real wages of unskilled workers through skill development and reducing poverty are among the core objectives of the 12th Five Year Plan.

10.2 The 12th Five Year Plan has identified the following primary causes of urban poverty and growth in slums:

- i) Structural - which include socially constructed constraints to opportunities for low-income groups;
- ii) Influx of a large number of workers to cities without commensurate job opportunities and availability of housing and basic amenities;
- iii) High cost of living, including the cost of health care and medical facilities, housing, transport and education;
- iv) Lack of urban planning, especially for housing low-income categories and the provision of land for informal sector activities;
- v) Absence of adequate regulation to protect the economic interest of the poor; and
- vi) Lack of involvement of the poor in urban planning and developmental processes.

10.3 The 12th Five Year Plan has adopted the objectives of urban poverty alleviation and slum development/upgradation as part of the strategy of ‘inclusive growth’ (see Boxes 1 & 2). ‘Inclusive cities’ are needed as key instruments of ‘Faster, Sustainable and More inclusive growth’. The development of inclusive cities needs meticulous and ‘informed’ planning, policy-making, programme formulation and implementation based on authentic and reliable data.
