Public Financial Management System (PFMS)



PFMS a web based application is an online management information and decision support system for the PMAY(U) mission, Government of India. The key objective of PFMS system is to monitor real time disbursement and utilization of funds under various schemes. It also ensures the digital transfers and tracking of funds to the lowest level of implementation. This system enhances the transparency and accountability in public expenditure. It helps in curbing leakages and duplication. The traditional method of cheque payment used to take 15 days, which is curtailed to 24 hours only with PFMS method. The State of UTTAR PRADESH has been

using the DBT method since June'18 and has become the 1st STATE to make the maximum payments vis PFMS with Rs 2140.96cr to 176365 beneficiaries in BLC vertical.
