Hon'ble Minister sanctions over 42,000 houses under PMAY-U 2.0 in Madhya Pradesh; 38,000 families perform grih pravesh



In a major boost to the 'Housing for All' initiative in Madhya Pradesh, Hon'ble Minister for Housing and Urban Affairs, Shri Manohar Lal led a landmark programme at Sanwer in Indore district on 20th June 2026 in the presence of Hon'ble Chief Minister, Dr Mohan Yadav, benefiting over 80,000 families under Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana – Urban (PMAY-U) scheme through house sanctions and Grih Pravesh. Hon'ble Minister, Urban Development & Housing, Government of Madhya Pradesh, Shri Kailash Vijayvargiya, and Hon'ble Minister of State - Urban Administration & Development, Smt Pratima Bagri and other Ministers of the State Government were also present at the occasion.

Under PMAY-U 2.0, sanction letters were issued to over 42,000 eligible beneficiaries, involving ₹1,050 crore subsidy from the Government. Further, 38,000 families performed Grih Pravesh of their newly constructed pucca houses in different districts of Madhya Pradesh.

Addressing the gathering, Hon'ble Minister, Shri Manohar Lal congratulated the beneficiaries on receiving the sanction for their homes and those entering their newly constructed houses. He stated that every new home represents dignity, security and hope for families and reaffirmed the Government's unwavering commitment to realising the vision of Housing for All under the leadership of Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi.

The programme marks another significant step in empowering additional 80,000 families by providing them with a permanent asset in the form of a pucca house.

Hon'ble Minister reviews Urban Development Schemes in Madhya Pradesh

The meeting was held in the presence of Hon'ble Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh, Dr Mohan Yadav, along with senior officials from the Central and State Governments. The review covered the progress of major urban development programmes, including



PMAY-U with emphasis on expediting implementation, strengthening urban infrastructure and improving citizen-centric service delivery. Shri RK Gautam, Deputy Director General (DDG), Housing for All represented the PMAY-U Mission during the meeting.

Strengthening Urban Housing: Hon'ble CM of Madhya Pradesh meets Hon'ble Minister for Housing & Urban Affairs

During the meeting, the two dignitaries discussed about the MoHUA flagship urban missions, including Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana – Urban (PMAY-U). During the event, the Hon'ble Chief Minister also handed over a check for ₹1,00,000 as the first instalment to a beneficiary of PMAY-U 2.0 as the housing subsidy to support the construction of her pucca house under the scheme.



Grih Pravesh Ceremony Marks New Beginning for 328 Families in Rourkela

On 13th May 2026, Hon'ble Minister for Housing & Urban Development, Government of Odisha, Shri Krushna Chandra Mahapatra attended the Grih Pravesh ceremony and handed over newly-built houses to 328 beneficiaries at the Chhend affordable housing project under Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana – Urban in Rourkela.

During the visit, the Hon'ble Minister also reviewed the project's implementation and infrastructure facilities and interacted with the beneficiaries. He congratulated the new homeowners and highlighted the Government's commitment to ensure Housing for All.



Secretary, MoHUA chairs 7th CSMC meeting, over 2.13 lakh additional houses under PMAY-U 2.0 approved

In a significant boost to the Housing for All mission, over 2.13 lakh houses for eligible urban poor families were sanctioned under PMAY-U 2.0 at the 7th meeting of the Central Sanctioning and Monitoring Committee (CSMC), chaired by Shri Srinivas Katikithala, Secretary, MoHUA at Sankalp Bhawan in New Delhi on 17th June 2026. The meeting was also attended by Shri Kuldeep Narayan, JS&MD, Housing for All (HFA), Shri Sanjeet, Joint Secretary & Financial Advisor (JS&FA), Shri RK Gautam, Deputy Director General (DDG), HFA and other senior officials from the Ministry, along with PMAY-U Mission Directors from participating States/UTs.

The latest sanctions have taken the total number of houses approved under PMAY-U 2.0 to over 16.13 lakh, accelerating the pace of affordable housing delivery with basic amenities across the country.

The houses have been sanctioned under Beneficiary Led Construction (BLC) – 1.89 lakh houses and Affordable Housing in Partnership (AHP) verticals – 23,602 houses of PMAY-U 2.0 in 16 States, namely Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Haryana, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Mizoram, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Odisha, Rajasthan, Telangana, Tripura and Uttar Pradesh.





During the meeting, the Committee also reviewed the progress of PMAY-U 2.0 and discussed measures to accelerate grounding of sanctioned houses, project monitoring and prioritising housing projects in proximity to mass transit corridors for improved connectivity and quality of life for beneficiaries.

In the 7th meeting of the CSMC, out of the 2.13 lakh houses sanctioned under PMAY-U 2.0, 2.05 lakh houses have been allotted to women, including widows, females who are separated or unmarried. 22 are sanctioned for transgenders. Further, 25,035 houses have been allotted to senior citizens. While 34,257 houses have been

sanctioned for SC beneficiaries, 22,516 are for ST beneficiaries whereas, 87,077 are for OBC beneficiaries.

Overall, under the 16.13 lakh houses sanctioned, 12.99 lakh are BLC houses and 1.81 lakh are AHP while 1.20 lakh houses are allotted to Interest Subsidy Scheme vertical beneficiaries and 12,846 are sanctioned as Affordable Rental Housing. Among the sanctioned houses, 97% is allotted to women (in the name of female head of the household or in joint ownership), 2.97 lakh to beneficiaries from Scheduled Castes, 84,293 from Scheduled Tribes, 7.26 lakh from Other Backward Classes/Minorities.

Shri Kuldeep Narayan, Joint Secretary & Mission Director (JS&MD), Housing for All led a delegation of officials of the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) at World Urban Forum (WUF) 2026 held in Baku from 17–22 May 2026, on the theme 'Housing the World: Safe and Resilient Cities and Communities'. Convened by UN-Habitat, the forum brought together global leaders, policymakers, urban practitioners and development experts to deliberate on the future of cities and housing. India reaffirmed its commitment towards sustainable, inclusive and resilient urban development at the WUF. The India Pavilion, themed "India's Urban Transformation: Housing a Billion

showcased India's progress in improving urban living through large-scale policy interventions and innovative implementation models. The pavilion was inaugurated by India Ambassador to Azerbaijan Shri Abhay Kumar. The pavilion also served as a platform for dialogue, collaboration and exchange of best practices among international stakeholders.



Delivering India’s official statement during the World Urban Forum, JS&MD, HFA shared that India’s participation at the global forum highlighted the country’s transformative urban initiatives, particularly in affordable housing, climate-resilient infrastructure and technology-driven governance over the past decade, as a result of which India has been at the forefront through citizen-centric, mission-driven approach.

A major focus was on the success of Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana – Urban (PMAY-U) and the evolving PMAY-U 2.0 scheme. JS&MD said that the scheme stands out as a flagship example of effective institutional delivery aimed at fulfilling the ‘Housing for All’ vision. He further highlighted how, with a sanction of more than 12 million houses and more than 90% houses allotted for women, the mission is transforming the lives of millions of families.

Discussions also highlighted initiatives such as Light House Projects and the adoption of globally proven construction technologies for affordable housing and also, on rental housing.

He also spoke about robust planning, cooperative federalism and digital governance tools to ensure transparency and accountability.

The World Urban Forum 2026 concluded with the “Baku Call to Action,” urging nations to prioritise inclusive housing systems, climate resilience, and stronger urban governance frameworks to address the growing global housing crisis.

The delegation was briefed on successful implementation of PMAY-U, launch of PMAY-U 2.0 to further the goal of Housing for All by expanding access to affordable housing for eligible urban families.

The discussion also covered affordable housing policy framework, beneficiary-centric approach, innovative financing mechanisms, rental housing initiatives and technology-driven interventions that are transforming the urban housing landscape.

The interaction served as a valuable platform to exchange knowledge and best practices on affordable housing, while promoting inclusive, resilient and sustainable urban development.





JS&MD chairs session on 'Housing, Built Environment and New Construction Technologies to Promote Urban Resilience'

In the Golden Jubilee celebrations of National Institute of Urban Affairs in New Delhi on 13th June 2026, Shri Kuldeep Narayan, JS&MD chaired a technical session on 'Housing, Built Environment and New Construction Technologies to Promote Urban Resilience'. The session was also live casted on youtube.

Highlights:

- ◆ A safe and secure home is the first layer of urban resilience for any individual and family, providing safety, stability and dignity. So, Housing Resilience is most important component of urban resilience.

- ◆ JS emphasized the need to scale innovative, sustainable and resilient construction technologies to build future-ready cities and stronger communities. Further Social, Economic and Environmental aspects of Housing Resilience were discussed.

- ◆ The session benefited from the valuable insights shared by the esteemed panellists from NHB, TERI, World Bank, Mahila Housing SEWA Trust, BMTPC and NIUA - fostering a meaningful dialogue on advancing resilient and sustainable urban development.



JS&MD, HFA reviews PMAY-U & LHP progress in Tripura

Shri Kuldeep Narayan, JS&MD, HFA visited Agartala, Tripura on 11th May 2026 to review the progress of PMAY-U and assess the implementation of the scheme across the State. He was accompanied by Shri RK Gautam, Deputy Director General (DDG), HFA and other officials from MoHUA and State Government. The visit focused on accelerating completion of PMAY-U houses, monitoring progress of PMAY-U 2.0, strengthening geo-tagging and ensuring timely delivery of houses to beneficiaries.

JS&MD directed State/ULB officials to intensify field-level monitoring, remove bottlenecks in construction, ensure adherence to quality standards and expedite the release and utilization of funds so that sanctioned houses translate into completed homes within stipulated timelines.

During the visit, JS&MD, HFA also reviewed the on-ground progress and completion status of Light House Project (LHP) Agartala, which is in the final stages of construction. He directed officials to ensure timely completion of all remaining works, including basic services and infrastructure. The project will provide modern, resilient and quality housing, along with improved infrastructure facilities to around 1,000 families.



JS&MD Reviews Nationwide progress of PMAY-U & PMAY-U 2.0

Shri Kuldip Narayan, JS&MD, HFA chaired a two-day virtual meeting with PMAY-U Mission Directors from all States/UTs on 2nd and 3rd June 2026 to review the progress of PMAY-U and PMAY-U 2.0 across the country. The meeting was also attended by Shri RK Gautam, DDG, HFA, along with senior officials from the Ministry.

The review focused on accelerating implementation of ongoing projects under the scheme, expediting application process and approvals under PMAY-U 2.0, ensuring timely completion of sanctioned houses for eligible urban families, strengthening beneficiary outreach and enhancing geo-tagging for effective monitoring. JS&MD emphasised on the need for close coordination among implementing agencies to address bottlenecks and accelerate construction activities, particularly in projects nearing completion.

A key area of discussion was the rollout and implementation of PMAY-U 2.0. Shri Kuldip Narayan reviewed the progress of beneficiary applications received under the scheme and urged States and UTs to expedite scrutiny, approval, and sanctioning processes to ensure that eligible urban families can avail housing assistance without delay. He stressed the importance of maintaining transparency, accuracy, and efficiency in beneficiary selection and application processing.



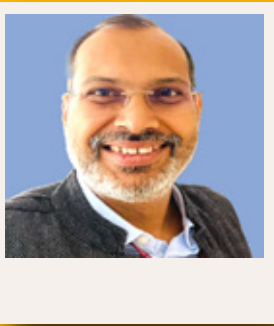
DDG, HFA visits Light House Project Indore

Director, HFA reviews progress of PMAY-U in Jharkhand and Chhattisgarh



Shri Vaibhav Rundwal, Director, HFA visited Jharkhand and Chhattisgarh on 7-9th May and 19-20th May 2026, respectively to review Affordable Housing in Partnership (AHP) and Beneficiary Led Construction (BLC) projects under PMAY-U in both the States.

In Jharkhand, Director, HFA visited different districts in Ranchi, Hazaribagh, Giridih and Deoghar while in Chhattisgarh, he went to oversee projects in Jagdalpur and Raipur districts.

He reviewed the ongoing works, interacted with beneficiaries to understand the positive changes they have witnessed through the PMAY-U scheme and assessed construction progress. For the under-construction projects, Director, HFA instructed officials to ensure quality and timely completion, along with early allotment of vacant houses and meanwhile, encouraged beneficiaries to complete their homes at the earliest.





Angikaar: Reaching the Last Mile

Under the PMAY-U 2.0, extensive awareness and IEC activities are being carried out across the country under Angikaar 2026 campaign to ensure that the benefits of the scheme reach every eligible household. Promotion of the scheme is being carried out through different mediums such as street plays, print and digital media, social media platforms, community meetings, wall paintings, door-to-door surveys and distribution of pamphlets and leaflets, among others.

In addition, dedicated awareness and registration camps and beneficiary outreach drives are being organised at the ULB level to facilitate new on-the-spot registrations and provide on-ground support to citizens. These efforts are aimed at enhancing awareness, improving accessibility and ensuring wider participation at the grassroots level, thereby strengthening the Mission.

Complementing these efforts, targeted outreach activities are also conducted for eligible beneficiaries to provide clear information on eligibility criteria, benefits and the application process. These camps served as important touchpoints for addressing queries and guiding potential beneficiaries through the process.

Dedicated beneficiary outreach activities have played a key role in enhancing citizen awareness and ensuring that no deserving family is left behind. States like Assam, Maharashtra, Haryana, Bihar, Andhra Pradesh and Tripura are extensively hosting different camps.

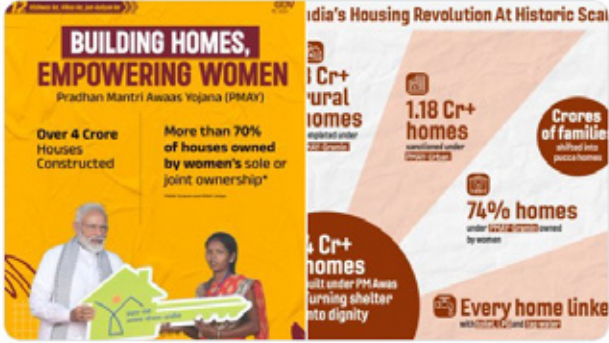

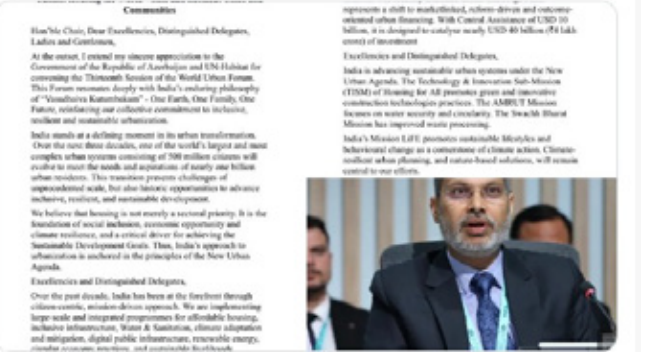
