Key handing over ceremony of Affordable Housing in Partnership (AHP) houses in Andhra Pradesh

On 30th June 2022, a total number of 5,056 PMAY-U beneficiaries at Pedapuram, Samalkot and Tadepalligudem were handed over keys to their AHP houses by Hon'ble Minister of Municipal Administration and Urban Development, Govt of Andhra Pradesh, Shri Audimulapu Suresh. Hon'ble Member of Parliament Smt Vanga Geetha Vishwanath, Hon'ble Chairman of APSHCL Shri D. Dora Babu, Mission Director-APTIDCO Shri Sridhar Chitturi and other officials participated in the event.

On 1st July 2022, a similar event was held in East Godavari district's Rajamahendravaram Municipal Corporation, Bommuru, wherein 3,424 beneficiaries were given keys to AHP houses by Shri Audimulapu Suresh, Hon'ble Minister of Municipal Administration and Urban Development.

over ceremony was held on 16th July 2022 for 5,103 PMAY-U beneficiaries in the august presence of Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh Shri K. Shri Durga Shanker Mishra, Chief Secretary, Government of Uttar Pradesh visits Light House Project Lucknow



On 5th July 2022, Shri Durga Shanker Mishra, Chief Secretary, Government of Uttar Pradesh, and Shri Amrit Abhijat, Principal Secretary, Urban Development, Government of Uttar Pradesh, visited Light House Project (LHP) in Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh to review the progress on site. A detailed review of the housing project was undertaken by Shri Mishra where he was briefed about the progress by construction agency officials and other State Government officials.

A total of 1,040 affordable houses are under construction in LHP Lucknow. Already in use in Canada and Australia - 'Stay In Place PVC Formwork with Pre-Engineered Steel Structural System' technology – has been adopted here for construction purpose.

Shri Vinay Kumar Choubey, Secretary, Urban Development and Housing Department, Government of Jharkhand, along with Shri Aditya Kumar Anand, Director, Directorate of Municipal Administration and Mission Director, Government of Jharkhand and reviewed the progress of Light House Project in Ranchi on 20th July 2022. Shri Shashi Ranjan, Municipal Commissioner, Ranchi also accompanied them along with other State Government officials.

Here, 'Precast Concrete Construction System – 3D Volumetric' has been adopted to construct 1,008 houses. It is the modern method of building by which solid precast concrete structural modules like room, toilet, kitchen, bathroom, stairs are cast monolithically in plant or casting yard in a controlled condition.

JS&MD (HFA) reviews progress of PMAY-U in Uttarakhand & Bihar

Shri RK Gautam, Director, HFA reviews progress of Light House Project, Indore

Shri RK Gautam, Director, HFA, MoHUA, reviewed implementation of LHP in Indore, Madhya Pradesh, on 9th July 2022. He evaluated the progress of the project with respect to construction and its execution at different stages and undertook a visit to the sample flat constructed on site. The agency was directed to expedite the construction process so that





the work on the project is completed on time for the benefit of its beneficiaries.

Prefabricated Sandwich Panel System with Pre-Engineered Steel Structural System', an already established system for building construction technology has been selected for construction of 1,024 houses at LHP Indore. It replaces conventional brick and mortar walling construction practices.

Another problem which added to their woes, especially for the women of the household, was lack of proper toilets. "Without access to a private toilet, the women often felt helpless, and a constant fear kept lingering in my mind considering their safety and security," Shri Samal added. He further said that

come for our daughter, but the prospective families always refused the match seeing the deplorable life we were leading in our kutcha house," they say.

At the age of 60, Shri Amulya Samal realised what a life of safety and security means while living in a pucca house. In 2020, Shri Samal, his wife Smt Manju and children Umesh and Mina moved into their dream house - a pucca one with all basic amenities. The family resides in Cuttack, Odisha The family of four had been living in a kutcha house and it was in 2020 after getting a

looking at how the family was staying, he desperately looked for opportunities to give them a dignified life, however, meagre income from his tailoring profession did not allow him to fulfil the dreams he saw for his family.

For the family, the house is their prized possession and it also turned out to be their greatest blessing in life as it was because of it that their daughter got married. Shri Amulya Samal and Smt Manju explain that owing to their poor living conditions, they could not find any alliance for their daughter. "Many marriage proposals would

in their lives to lead a life of dignity and security.

The year 2019 changed the Samal family's lives forever when, through an IEC campaign in their locality, they got to know about PMAY (Urban) and how the Scheme gives central assistance to eligible beneficiaries of urban India to build a pucca house with basic amenities. Shri Amulya Samal immediately filled in the application and then, there was no looking back for the family. Shri Amulya Samal and Smt Manju are now proud owners of a pucca house with a bedroom, kitchen, and all other basic facilities like access to drinking water, toilet, and electricity.

They were also able to marry off their daughter. "Iss ghar me gane ke baad humari beti ki shaadi ho gai, ye sabse bada aashirwad tha. Ab koi dikkat nahi hai, beta bhi ghar chalane me madad karta hai. Meri aadhi se zyada zindagi ek kutche ghar me aur parivar ki zarurate puri karne me nikal gai. Ab hum budhape me apne ghar me ek khushal jeevan jee rahe hain, isse zyada bhagwan se aur kuch nahi chahiye," a teary-eyed Shri Amulya Samal expressed, thanking the Central and State Governments for the financial aid.

Webinar on 'e-Learning and Webcasting of Light House Project for Technograhis' held at Lucknow & Chennai

The 10th and 11th editions of 'e-Learning sessions and webcasting of LHPs for Technograhis' were held at LHP sites in Lucknow and Chennai on 30th June 2022 and 14th July 2022, respectively. LHP Lucknow is currently under construction while LHP Chennai has already been inaugurated and is in process of being occupied by beneficiaries.

Under these Webinar series, technical sessions on LHP technologies, construction processes and their replication in Indian context are organised by BMTPC. The participants are also given detailed presentations on LHP technology specification through live photos and videos. Each session of Webinar focuses on a particular LHP site. These webinars have proved to be one-stop learning and knowledge sharing platform for Technograhis and other stakeholders.



The webinar in Chennai was held for the first time after it was inaugurated by Hon'ble Prime Minister on 26th May 2022. The webinar witnessed a significant moment when beneficiaries of LHP Chennai came live to share their life transforming experiences with participants. The beneficiaries expressed how they are living a safe and secured life in their own pucca houses. They said that their lives are now filled with joy & happiness.

RACHNA training programme on Innovative Construction Technologies & Thermal Comfort in Affordable Housing

RACHNA is a unique concept initiated by MoHUA to organise training programmes and workshops across the country for different range of stakeholders to disseminate knowledge on Innovative Construction Technologies and Thermal Comfort in Affordable Housing.

RACHNA, which stands for Resilient, Affordable, Comfortable Housing with National Action, is a joint effort of MoHUA, Building Materials and Technology Promotion Council (BMTPC) and GIZ.



In the series, 2-day vocational trainings #42nd and #43rd were conducted in Ahmedabad and Agartala simultaneously for construction labourers. The #44th workshop was held for practitioners in Kolkata. Training #45 was on the theme of emerging construction technologies & thermal comfort and was designed specifically for Government officials in Bengaluru. Training #47 in Guwahati and #49 in



Gorakhpur was also held on the same topic targeting Government officials; whereas the #46th workshop was hosted online for practitioners while the #48th was a vocational training for construction labourers held at Affordable Housing in Partnership (AHP) site in Vavdi, Rajkot.

At Benguluru, RACHNA marked the milestone of completing the 50th workshop, held for practitioners for two days.

The #51st and #52nd trainings were held online for Government officials. The #53rd training was an awareness drive at an architectural college in Bhubaneswar. Subsequently, the #54th, #56th and #58th trainings were on emerging construction technologies for thermal comfort, designed for practitioners. The #57th training, however, was held online for practitioners.

Training #23, which earlier got postponed was held in Mumbai for practitioners. The 59^{th} programme was also held for practitioners via online mode. Training #60th was held on emerging construction technologies for thermal comfort for Practitioners. The #61st, 63^{rd} and 64^{th} trainings were on Climate Smart Building, held at Bhopal, Agartala and Gandhinagar, respectively, while the #62nd was an awareness drive at architectural college in Jharkhand.

Distribution of allotment letters to beneficiaries of LHP Ranchi

On 19th July 2022, Ranchi Municipal Corporation (RMC) organised house allotment programme at LHP Ranchi. During the event, 1008 houses were allotted to beneficiaries through a lottery system. Over 1,500 applications were received against the 1,008 houses, out of which 1,302 applications were found suitable after scrutiny, for which the lottery program was organised. The smiling faces explain the happiness and joy of families who will soon be able to live in their own pucca houses.
